

CLOTHES DEFINITIONS

- Apron** /'eɪprən/ A piece of clothing you wear when cooking to keep your clothes clean.
- Bathrobe** /'bɑ:θrəʊb/ A soft coat that you wear before or after a bath.
- Belt** /belt/ A long, thin piece of leather, cloth, or plastic that you wear around your waist.
- Beret** /'beret/ A round, flat hat made of soft material.
- Blouse** /blaʊz/ A piece of clothing like a shirt that women wear.
- Boots** /bu:ts/ Strong shoes that cover your feet and part of your legs.
- Bow tie** /bəʊ taɪ / A special type of tie in the shape of a bow, worn especially by men on formal occasions.
- Bra** /brɑ:/ A piece of woman's underwear that supports the breasts.
- Braces** /'breɪsɪz/ Two straps fixed to a pair of trousers that go over your shoulders and stop the trousers from falling down.
- Brooch** /brəʊtʃ/ A piece of jewellery for women which is fastened onto clothes with a pin.
- Cap** /kæp/ A hat with a flat, curved part at the front.
- Cardigan** /'kɑ:dɪgən/ A piece of clothing, often made of wool, that covers the top part of your body and fastens at the front.
- Clogs** /klɒgz/ Shoes made from wood, or shoes with a wooden sole.
- Coat** /kəʊt/ A piece of clothing with sleeves that you wear over your other clothes, especially when you go outside.
- Denim jacket** /'denɪm 'dʒækɪt / A short coat made from denim(a thick, strong, cotton cloth, usually blue).
- Dress** /dres/ A piece of clothing for women or girls which covers the top of the body and hangs down over the legs.
- Dressing gown** /dresɪŋ gaʊn / A piece of clothing, like a long coat, that you wear at home when you are not dressed.
- Gloves** /glɒvz/ A piece of clothing which covers your fingers and hand.
- Handbag** /'hændbæg/ A bag carried by a woman with her money, keys, etc inside.
- Handkerchief** /'hæŋkətʃi:f/ A small piece of cloth or soft paper that you use to dry your eyes or nose.
- Hat** /hæt/ Something you wear to cover your head, for fashion or protection.
- Helmet** /'helmət/ A hard hat that protects your head.
- Hood** /hʊd/ A part of a coat or jacket that covers your head and neck.
- Jacket** /'dʒækɪt/ A short coat.
- Jeans** /dʒi:nz/ Trousers made from denim (= a strong, usually blue, material).
- Jersey** /'dʒɜ:zi/ A piece of clothing which covers the top of your body and is pulled on over your head.
- Jewellery** /'dʒu:əlri/ Objects made from gold, silver, and valuable stones that you wear for decoration.
- Jumper** /'dʒʌmpə/ A loose dress with no sleeves that is worn over other clothes such as a shirt.
- Kilt** /kɪlt/ A traditional Scottish skirt for men, made of heavy material with close vertical folds at the back.
- Knickers** /'nɪkəz/ Women's underwear that covers the bottom.
- Laces** /leɪsɪz/ Strings used to tie shoes.
- Mac** /mæk/ A coat that you wear in the rain.
- Necklace** /'nekləs/ A piece of jewellery that you wear around your neck.
- Nightdress** /'naɪtdres/ A loose dress that women wear in bed.
- Pocket** /'pɒkɪt/ A small bag that is fixed on a piece of clothing.

Pyjamas /pɪ'dʒɑ:məz/ Shirt and trousers that you wear in bed.

Raincoat /'reɪnkəʊt/ A coat that you wear when it is raining.

Ribbon /'rɪbən/ A long, narrow piece of cloth that is used for tying things or used for decoration.

Sandals /'sændəls/ Light shoes with straps that you wear in warm weather.

Scarf /ska:f/ A piece of cloth that you wear around your neck, head, or shoulders to keep warm or for decoration.

Shirt /ʃɜ:t/ A piece of clothing worn on the top part of the body, often made of thin material like cotton and fastened with buttons down the front.

Shoes /ʃu:z/ A strong covering for the foot, often made of leather.

Shorts /ʃɔ:ts/ A very short pair of trousers that stop above the knees.

Skirt /skɜ:t/ A piece of women's clothing that hangs from the waist and has no legs.

Slippers /'slɪpərs/ Soft, comfortable shoes that you wear in the house.

Socks /sɒks/ Something that you wear on your foot inside your shoe.

Stockings /'stɒkɪŋs/ Very thin pieces of clothing that cover a woman's foot and leg.

Suit /su:t/ A jacket and trousers or a jacket and skirt that are made from the same material.

Sweater /'swetə:/ A warm piece of clothing which covers the top of your body and is pulled on over your head.

Sweatshirt /'swetʃɜ:t/ A piece of clothing made of soft cotton which covers the top of your body and is pulled on over your head.

Swimming costume /'swɪmɪŋ 'kɒstju:m/ A piece of clothing that woman wear to go swimming.

Swimming trunks /'swɪmɪŋ trʌŋks/ A piece of clothing that boys and men wear when they swim.

Tie /taɪ/ A long, thin piece of cloth that a man wears around his neck with a shirt.

Tights /taɪts/ A piece of women's clothing made of very thin material that covers the legs and bottom.

Tracksuit /'træksu:t/ Loose, comfortable clothes, usually trousers and a top, especially worn for exercising.

Trainers /'treɪnərs/ **Sneakers** /'sni:kərs/ Soft sports shoes.

Trousers /'traʊzəz/ A piece of clothing that covers the legs and has a separate part for each leg.

T-shirt /'ti:ʃɜ:t/ A piece of cotton clothing for the top part of the body with short sleeves and no collar.

Underpants /'ʌndəpænts/ A piece of underwear that covers the area between your waist and the top of your legs.

Underwear /'ʌndəweə/ The clothes that you wear next to your skin, under your other clothes.

Uniform /'ju:nɪfɔ:m/ A special set of clothes that are worn by people who do a particular job or people who go to a particular school.

Waistcoat /'weɪstkəʊt/ A piece of clothing with buttons at the front and no sleeves, that you wear over a shirt.

Wallet /'wɒlɪt/ A small, flat container for paper money and credit cards, usually used by a man.

Zip /zɪp/ A thing for fastening clothes, bags, etc consisting of two rows of very small parts that connect together.
